Pre-ACT Test for Sophomores

The Pre-ACT test is a practice test that aligns to the ACT test that serves as an indicator to student readiness for college. Students who do well on the ACT can earn scholarships toward college and other post-secondary education. ACT scores are also used to determine if students should be required to take remedial courses at their university.

CHS sophomores will take the Pre-ACT test on November 9. Results from this test will be used to support students' preparation for the real ACT by identifying areas that need more support. Students will also be provided with career planning results that will help guide them as they explore their future career paths.
