AFJROTC is a partnership between the Air Force and Central High School focused on developing the leaders of tomorrow, providing opportunities to students, and preparing them for success in life.

AFJROTC Curriculum

Three focus areas of study:

- Aerospace Science (AS): History of Aviation, Principles of Flight, Meteorology, Navigation, Flight Physiology, Aerospace Technology, and Exploration of Space
- Leadership Education (LE): Professional Development, Uniform Wear, Drill, Customs/Courtesies/Respect, Leadership, Communication, and Management Skills
- Health/Wellness (H/W): Importance of a Healthy Lifestyle, Presidential Fitness Program, Teambuilding, Stress Management, Risk Management, and First Aid

Offered as a blended course, including all three areas of study

- Year-long course; 1.0 elective credit
- Half-year entrance/exit of course on a case-by-case basis
- Monday/Wednesday: Aerospace Science (40% of grade)
- Tuesday/Thursday: Leadership Education (40% of grade)
- Friday: Health/Wellness (20% of grade)

AFJROTC Courses

Traditional Course: Freshmen/Sophomores

- First Year: AS-100, LE-100, H/W
- Second Year: AS-200/220, LE-200, H/W
- Third Year: AS-300, LE-300, H/W
- Fourth Year: AS-400, LE-400, H/W

Accelerated Course: Juniors/Seniors

- Compressed program will include main elements of 100/200-level courses and also introduce more advanced 300-400-level courses

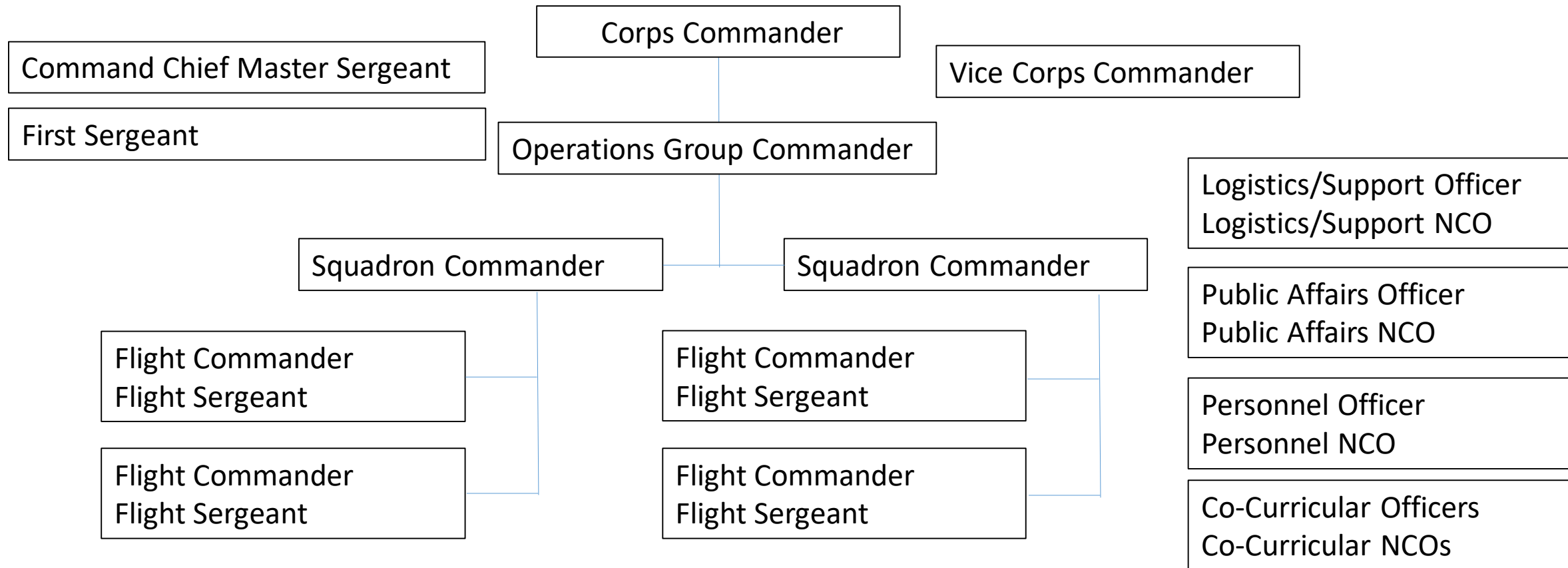
Training Certification:
